The undersigned, as participant and parents or legal guardians of a participant in a program organised and directed by Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. Organisation on behalf of ourselves and our successors or legal representatives, renounce to any claim against, Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner Organisation, its employees, agents, teachers, coordinators, and schools where the participant may be assigned, of any person intervening in the program, that may arise due to injury, damage, sickness, accident, delay, unusual circumstances of expenses due to strikes, war, atmospheric conditions, quarantine, government restrictions or regulations, or those derived from acts of omission of airlines, shipping companies, railroads, buses, transportation in general, hotels, restaurants or any other service given by companies, individuals or anyone related with the aforementioned.

We understand that the participant will be subject to the authorities and teachers of the school where he/she may be assigned and that he/she will have to follow the rules given by the family with whom he/she may live. We also understand that Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner Organisation reserves the right to terminate the participation in the program of any participant whose conduct may be considered detrimental or incompatible with the interest and security of the program. If this decision is ever taken, the participant and his/her parents or legal guardians will have no right to any refunds.

We accept the right of Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner Organisation to directly or indirectly, cancel, change, before and after departure, the cost of the program to meet unexpected changes in air fares, price of transportation in general, monetary devaluations, etc. We understand that should there be a geographic move of the student for any reason whatsoever the cost of transportation shall be borne by the participant.

We guarantee Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner Organisation that, although we may maintain in the future a friendly relationship with the school, local coordinator, and family or families, with whom we may establish contact through Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner organisation, or its employees, we will not make use of this knowledge to send in the future, directly or indirectly, relatives or friends, to said school, local coordinators, or families, unless it is through Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner organisation. 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MEDICAL RELEASE

We grant Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner Organisation, its employees or agents, the school where the participant may be assigned, and the family or families with whom he/she may live that, at their discretion, and if necessary, at the cost of the participant or his/her parents or legal guardians – in the case of expenses exceeding the coverage of the insurance policy covering the participant - the power to place him/her in a hospital or in any other institution for any type of assistance or medical treatment or, if there is no hospital available, to place him/her under the care of a local medical doctor for his/her treatment.

We also grant Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner Organisation, the school where the participant may be assigned, and the family or families with whom he/she may live, all necessary permission to act as legal guardians and in “loco parents” in any situation, especially in emergencies, whether medical or other, including the possibility of permission for surgical operations or any other treatment.

We also authorise Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc, and the Partner Organisation, the school where the participant may be assigned and the family or families with whom he/she may live to return him/her to his/her country or origin at his/her cost or that of his/her parents or legal guardian, if necessary, to submit to medical treatment, if this is deemed necessary by the above-mentioned people, after consultation with medical authorities. We confirm that at the time of signing this document the participant enjoys perfect health, that his/her health record enclosed herewith is true and complete.

TERMS OF UNDERSTANDING AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

All parties involved must work from the same framework and toward the same goal. To ensure this understanding the undersigned student and parents of the student understand that the student must obey all governmental regulations covering immigration, federal, state and local laws, as well as the following rules set forth by Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partner organisation.

- 1. Drugs.** The purchase, possession, and/or use of illegal (non-prescription) drugs is forbidden. Furthermore, no association is to be maintained with anyone involved with drugs or drug use in any way.
- 2. Drinking.** The purchase, possession, and/or use of alcoholic beverages, beer and wine is forbidden.
- 3. Smoking.** The purchase, possession and/or use of tobacco products is forbidden.
- 4. Piercings and Tattoos.** The student is not allowed to get any tattoos and piercings during the duration of his/her program. Existing piercings are usually not permitted in the schools and will need to be removed.
- 5. Dangerous activities.** Skydiving, hang gilding, parachute jumping, jet skiing, bungee jumping, flying lessons, and riding in hot air balloons are prohibited.
- 6. Driving.** Because of the danger involved and lack of liability insurance, under no circumstance may a student drive a motorized vehicle for which an operator's license is required. Furthermore, students are not allowed to participate driver's training and to take their driving test.
- 7. Extensions.** Students on the Fall semester may transfer to the year program by applying and paying the difference in fees plus the established surcharge only if there is no change of host family or school. Any student extending his/her stay beyond the scheduled return will be considered terminated from the program and Canada immigration service will be notified that S.L.I. is no longer the student's Guardian and the student must then return home. No Minor students are allowed under Canadian law to be in Canada without a Guardian.
- 8. Final authority.** Students must respect all decisions made by Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and its coordinators or staff. Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. reserves the right to dismiss a student from the program, if there should arise, in the sole judgment of Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. Officials, a condition likely to be detrimental to the health of the student. Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. reserves the right to dismiss the student from the program should he/she violate the Standards of Conduct or for any other disciplinary problems.
- 9. Hitchhiking.** Hitchhiking is extremely dangerous. Students are not permitted to hitchhike, either alone or with friends.
- 10. Host Family Regulations.** Each host family has rules and regulations which help it function effectively . It is imperative that each student makes every effort possible to understand what his/her host family expects. Each student must be respectful of her/his host family and the rules that govern the household (including household chores and curfew hours). Activities must be approved by the host family. At all time, the student's host family must know where the student is, with whom, and when the student will return. It is the student's responsibility to provide that information to the host family when making plans.
 - 10.1** Any outings or family events or plans with the host family have priority over any other outing that the student may have. The student must ask (at least one week prior) if the host family has anything planned for the upcoming week.
 - 10.2** The student must not regularly meet or speak with other students from the same country or the same language. The student is here to perfect his new languages and to make friends in his/ her community or at school.
 - 10.3** Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. does not permit the "**After Prom**" parties unless the student can provide to their host family, the place, name, telephone number and the time of the event and that adults will be present and responsible for the party. Naturally, there will be no drugs or alcohol on the premises. The host family will take the necessary information before giving their permission.

TERMS OF UNDERSTANDING AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT (Cont'd)

11. Law Violations. If a student admits to a criminal law violation, or arrested and charged, or if reliable information is received that the student will be arrested and charged, **the student will be returned to his/her home country** as soon as legally possible. Students are expected to obey all Canadian laws. A student may not leave the program at any time without express written consent of Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. Students are not permitted to return home during the program. Doing so will be considered leaving the program. When a student leaves, except for emergencies, he/she may not return to the program. The student may leave the program due to death or serious illness in the family or for other bona fide emergency situations as determined by Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc.

12. Money. Because each student is responsible to purchase his/her personal items, clothing, entertainment, etc. each student is required to have at his/her disposal, **a minimum of \$200 each month.** Each student is responsible for his/her own spending money. S.L.I. is not responsible for any lost or stolen money. It is against S.L.I. regulations for the student to place his/her money in a host family bank account. Further, no student shall lend to, or borrow money from any member of his/her host family.

13. School. The student must attend school regularly and obey all school rules. The student is expected to show interest in his/her school work and make an effort to do his/her best. If, in the school's or S.L.I.'s opinion, the student needs a language tutor to succeed in his/her class(es), S.L.I. will help to arrange for such a tutor. The cost for tutoring will be the sole responsibility of the student's natural parents or guardians. Students must be academically equipped to maintain a "C" average in all subjects. If the student is given a failing mark in attitude as an official complaint from the school, he/she will be returned to his/her home country. Dismissal from school will result in dismissal from the program.

14. Sex. The Canadian school experience is not intended to be a time which romantic attachments are formed. The student is an ambassador for his/her country. Therefore, it is extremely important that the student's moral behaviour be beyond reproach at all times. If it is found that a student is involved in a sexual relationship while sponsored through the S.L.I. program, that student will be returned to his/her own country immediately. If it is found that student is pregnant while sponsored through the S.L.I. program, that student will be dismissed from the program.

15. Pornography. Purchase, possession and/or downloading of pornography is not permitted.

16. Internet and Email. While use of the internet and email is generally deemed acceptable, it may also be detrimental to a student's program. Students must respect and abide by host family and school rules in respect to the use of computer, internet and email.

17. Cellular Telephone and Laptop Computer. Cellular telephones, I-pods, Mp3 players are not permitted at school and will be automatically confiscated. Cellular telephones must only be used for emergencies. **Laptop computers are not recommended unless the school requires one.** If a student does bring a laptop computer, it will not be set-up in his/her bedroom but in a common family room, so that the use may be controlled. This is to minimize chatting, network games, computer games, internet etc. Cellular telephones, I-pods with internet connections must be placed in a common room after 9pm so that the student may not be tempted to use it.

18. Travel. Unsupervised/unauthorised student travel (including returning to student's home country) without Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. and the Partners Organisation's pre-approval is prohibited. During the program students may travel only with their host families, or on Séjours Linguistiques Internationaux Inc. or Partner Organisation events. Students will be permitted to travel while in Canada only according to the following conditions:

- 18.1** If with the host family and if longer than over night, the S.L.I. coordinator must be informed of the dates and provided with a phone contact where the student can be reached in case of emergency.
- 18.2** If with another family, the host family and S.L.I. coordinator must approve, in writing and the same regulations as "18.1" above apply.
- 18.3** School and group-sponsored trips are permitted providing there is adult supervision. Again, the host family and S.L.I. must approve, in writing and the same regulations as "18.1" above apply.
- 18.4** If independently to visit another family, the inviting family, must confirm the information with the host family and the S.L.I. coordinator and the host family and S.L.I. must approve, in writing and the same regulations as "18.1" above apply, and the student must travel directly, with no stopovers/layovers or changes of transportation. Student must be met in person by a responsible adult upon arrival.

Unauthorized travel may be cause for dismissal from the program.

TERMS OF UNDERSTANDING AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT (Cont'd)

19. Work and jobs. Students sponsored by S.L.I. are in Canada on a student Study Permit. It is against the law for a student to hold a job or seek employment.

20. Visits from relatives and friends. Visits from relatives and friend must be restricted to the end of the student's program (June 30). Earlier visits may result in disruption of the student/host family adaptation process. Approval of host family and S.L.I. must obtained prior to the visit. Guests must not expect that host families will be able to accommodate them in their home.
